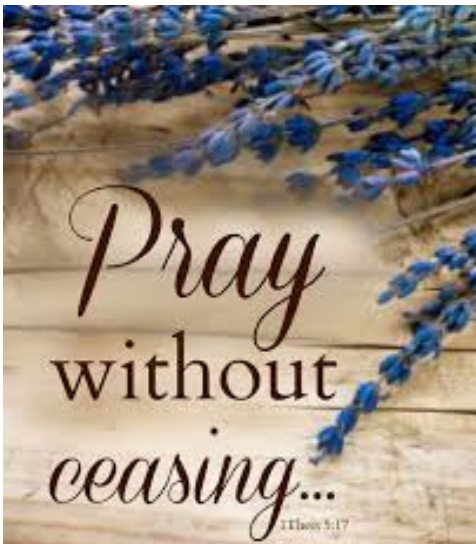

SAINTS PERPETUA & FELICITY ~ March 7

Saints Perpetua and Felicity were African martyrs who died in 203. They became Christian catechumens despite Emperor Severus' prohibition. The two young mothers were arrested but stayed true to their faith despite deplorable prison conditions and earnest pleas from St. Perpetua's father to renounce her faith. Along with three other catechumens, they were executed in the amphitheater at Carthage. As they awaited death, members of the group sang Christian songs and preached to the crowds. The eyewitness account of their arrest and martyrdom is a precious legacy to the Church.

Santas Perpetua y Felicidad fueron mártires africanas que murieron en el año 203. Se convirtieron en catecúmenos cristianos a pesar de la prohibición del emperador Severo. Las dos jóvenes madres fueron arrestadas, pero se mantuvieron fieles a su fe a pesar de las deplorables condiciones carcelarias y las fervientes súplicas del padre de Santa Perpetua para que renunciaran a su fe. Junto con otros tres catecúmenos, fueron ejecutados en el anfiteatro de Cartago. Mientras esperaban la muerte, los miembros del grupo cantaron canciones cristianas y predicaron a la multitud. El relato de los testigos oculares de su arresto y martirio es un legado precioso para la Iglesia.

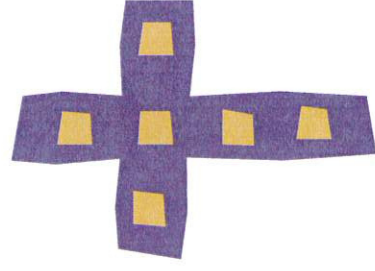

Gospel

Reflection

In today's Gospel we read about how Jesus overturned the tables of the merchants and the moneychangers in the Temple at Jerusalem. In order to understand the relevance of Jesus' action, we must learn more about the activities that were going on in the temple area. Worship at the Temple in Jerusalem included animal sacrifice, and merchants sold animals to worshipers. Moneychangers exchanged Roman coins, which bore the image of the Roman emperor, for the temple coins that were needed to pay the temple tax.

Jesus' action at the Temple in Jerusalem is recorded in all four Gospels and is often understood to be among the events that led to Jesus' arrest and Crucifixion. The Gospel of John, however, places this event much earlier in Jesus' public ministry than do the Synoptic Gospels. In John's Gospel this event occurs at the very beginning of Jesus' ministry, after his first miracle at the wedding feast at Cana.

We must read the Gospel of John carefully, especially in its presentation of Jesus' relationship to Judaism. The Gospel of John tends to reflect greater tension and animosity between Jesus and the Jewish authorities than the Synoptic Gospels. The Gospel of John was the last of the four Gospels to be written, and its narrative reflects the growing divide between the Jewish community and the early Christian community. Thus, greater emphasis on the distinction between Christianity and Judaism is found in John's Gospel.

Reflecting upon the destruction of the Temple of Jerusalem (A.D. 70), John recalls Jesus' cleansing of the Temple and uses that story to interpret this later event. John explains to his audience, an early Christian community, that temple worship would no longer be necessary because it was surpassed in the passion, death, and Resurrection of Jesus. With greater frequency than the other Evangelists, John intersperses post-Resurrection reflections of this Christian community in his narrative.

After clearing the Temple of the merchants and the moneychangers, John's Gospel tells us that the people asked for a sign of Jesus' authority to do such an audacious act. In response, Jesus predicted his death and Resurrection. Throughout John's Gospel, the language of signs is distinctive. Jesus' miracles are called signs, and the people look to these signs for proof of his authority. Here we learn that the sign par excellence will be Jesus' passion, death, and Resurrection.

During Lent we reflect upon the meaning of this sign for us and for our world. We might take this opportunity to consider the quality of our prayer and worship. In our prayers we seek to deepen our relationship with the person of Christ. In our worship with the community, we gather to experience anew the passion, death, and Resurrection of Jesus and its significance in our lives. Christ promises to be present with us when we gather for prayer.

En el evangelio de hoy leemos cómo Jesús volcó las mesas de los mercaderes y cambistas en el templo de Jerusalén. Para comprender la relevancia de la acción de Jesús, debemos aprender más sobre las actividades que se llevaban a cabo en el área del templo. La adoración en el Templo de Jerusalén incluía sacrificios de animales y los comerciantes vendían animales a los fieles. Los cambistas cambiaban monedas romanas, que llevaban la imagen del emperador romano, por las monedas del templo que se necesitaban para pagar el impuesto del templo.

La acción de Jesús en el Templo de Jerusalén está registrada en los cuatro evangelios y a menudo se entiende que está entre los eventos que llevaron al arresto y crucifixión de Jesús. El Evangelio de Juan, sin embargo, ubica este evento mucho antes en el ministerio público de Jesús que los Evangelios sinópticos. En el evangelio de Juan, este evento ocurre al comienzo mismo del ministerio de Jesús, después de su primer milagro en las bodas de Caná.

Debemos leer atentamente el Evangelio de Juan, especialmente en su presentación de la relación de Jesús con el judaísmo. El Evangelio de Juan tiende a reflejar una mayor tensión y animosidad entre Jesús y las autoridades judías que los Evangelios sinópticos. El Evangelio de Juan fue el último de los cuatro Evangelios que se escribió y su narrativa refleja la creciente división entre la comunidad judía y la comunidad cristiana primitiva. Por lo tanto, en el Evangelio de Juan se encuentra un mayor énfasis en la distinción entre cristianismo y judaísmo.

Al reflexionar sobre la destrucción del Templo de Jerusalén (70 d.C.), Juan recuerda la limpieza del Templo por parte de Jesús y utiliza esa historia para interpretar este evento posterior. Juan explica a su audiencia, una comunidad cristiana primitiva, que la adoración en el templo ya no sería necesaria porque fue superada en la pasión, muerte y resurrección de Jesús. Con mayor frecuencia que los otros evangelistas, Juan intercala reflexiones posteriores a la Resurrección de esta comunidad cristiana en su narrativa.

Después de limpiar el Templo de los mercaderes y cambistas, el Evangelio de Juan nos dice que el pueblo pidió una señal de la autoridad de Jesús para realizar tan audaz acto. En respuesta, Jesús predijo su muerte y resurrección. A lo largo del Evangelio de Juan, el lenguaje de las señales es distintivo. Los milagros de Jesús se llaman señales, y la gente busca en estas señales una prueba de su autoridad. Aquí aprendemos que el signo por excelencia será la pasión, muerte y resurrección de Jesús.

Durante la Cuaresma reflexionamos sobre el significado de este signo para nosotros y para nuestro mundo. Podríamos aprovechar esta oportunidad para considerar la calidad de nuestra oración y adoración. En nuestras oraciones buscamos profundizar nuestra relación con la persona de Cristo. En nuestro culto con la comunidad, nos reunimos para experimentar nuevamente la pasión, muerte y Resurrección de Jesús y su significado en nuestras vidas. Cristo promete estar presente con nosotros cuando nos reunimos para orar.
