

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King. Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical *Quas primas* ("In the first") to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever.

Christ's kingship is rooted in the Church's teaching on the Incarnation. Jesus is fully God and fully man. He is both the divine Lord and the man who suffered and died on the Cross. One person of the Trinity unites himself to human nature and reigns over all creation as the Incarnate Son of God. "From this it follows not only that Christ is to be adored by angels and men, but that to him as man angels and men are subject, and must recognize his empire; by reason of the hypostatic union Christ has power over all creatures" (*Quas primas*, 13). ***Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, Pray for Us.***



SAINT OF THE WEEK ~ November 26

St Leonard was born in Porto Maurizio in 1676, the son of a master mariner. He was a Franciscan friar of the Strict Observance who lived at the monastery of St. Bonaventure in Rome. He preached on devotions to the Blessed Sacrament, the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the Immaculate Conception of Mary and the Stations of the Cross, even building almost 600 stations in Italy, including one in the Colosseum. He was ordained in 1703 and became a sought after preacher of parish missions and retreats. The strain of his missionary labors and his mortifications had completely exhausted him when he died in 1751 at his Friary.

San Leonardo nació en Porto Maurizio en 1676, hijo de un maestro marino. Era un fraile franciscano de la Estricta Observancia que vivía en el monasterio de San Buenaventura en Roma. Predicó sobre la devoción al Santísimo Sacramento, el Sagrado Corazón de Jesús, la Inmaculada Concepción de María y el Vía Crucis, llegando incluso a construir casi 600 estaciones en Italia, incluida una en el Coliseo. Fue ordenado sacerdote en 1703 y se convirtió en un solicitado predicador de misiones y retiros parroquiales. La tensión de sus trabajos misioneros y sus mortificaciones lo habían agotado por completo cuando murió en 1751 en su convento.

Gospel

Reflection

Today's Gospel passage is the conclusion of Jesus' discourse with his disciples. It is about the end of time, the coming of the Son of Man, and the final judgment. We hear this description of the final judgment at the conclusion of our liturgical year, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King. In the context of Matthew's Gospel, this passage might also be read as a conclusion of Matthew's report on Jesus' life and ministry; the remaining chapters report the events of Jesus' Passion and Resurrection.

In today's Gospel, Jesus describes to his disciples the scene of the judgment of the Son of Man. All the nations will be assembled before him, and he will separate them as a shepherd separates sheep and goats upon their return from the pasture. The judgments made by the Son of Man will be based upon the acts of mercy shown to the least ones—the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, the ill, and the imprisoned. Indeed, Jesus, who suffered on the Cross, identifies himself with the least ones.

Recall that last week's parable of the talents taught us that the gifts that we have been given are intended to be used for the service of others, especially the least among us. Our judgment before God will be based not only on how we have used these gifts and talents, but also on how we have extended ourselves in service to these least ones. Indeed, Jesus tells us that whenever we have served these least ones, we have served Christ himself.

When we read today's Gospel in the context of the chapters that follow in Matthew's Gospel, we learn the extent to which Jesus identifies with the least ones. In accepting death on the cross, Jesus shows himself to be one of the hungry, the naked, the ill, and the imprisoned. To accept Jesus is to accept him who suffered and died on the Cross as one of the least ones.

El pasaje del Evangelio de hoy es la conclusión del discurso de Jesús con sus discípulos. Se trata del fin de los tiempos, la venida del Hijo del Hombre y el juicio final. Escuchamos esta descripción del juicio final al concluir nuestro año litúrgico, la Solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo Rey. En el contexto del Evangelio de Mateo, este pasaje también podría leerse como una conclusión del informe de Mateo sobre la vida y el ministerio de Jesús; los capítulos restantes relatan los acontecimientos de la Pasión y Resurrección de Jesús.

En el evangelio de hoy, Jesús describe a sus discípulos la escena del juicio del Hijo del Hombre. Todas las naciones se reunirán delante de él, y él las separará como el pastor separa las ovejas y las cabras cuando regresan del pasto. Los juicios del Hijo del Hombre se basarán en los actos de misericordia mostrados hacia los más pequeños: los hambrientos, los sedientos, los desnudos, los enfermos y los encarcelados. En efecto, Jesús, que sufrió en la Cruz, se identifica con los más pequeños.

Recuerde que la parábola de los talentos de la semana pasada nos enseñó que los dones que hemos recibido están destinados a ser utilizados para el servicio de los demás, especialmente de los más pequeños entre nosotros. Nuestro juicio ante Dios se basará no sólo en cómo hemos usado estos dones y talentos, sino también en cómo nos hemos extendido al servicio de los más pequeños. De hecho, Jesús nos dice que siempre que hemos servido a estos más pequeños, hemos servido a Cristo mismo.

Cuando leemos el Evangelio de hoy en el contexto de los capítulos que siguen del Evangelio de Mateo, aprendemos hasta qué punto Jesús se identifica con los más pequeños. Al aceptar la muerte en la cruz, Jesús se muestra como uno de los hambrientos, los desnudos, los enfermos y los encarcelados. Aceptar a Jesús es aceptar a Aquel que sufrió y murió en la Cruz como uno de los más pequeños.
